AUTISM FRIENDLY HOUR


North Watford Library Every Saturday 9:30-10:30 Between these times the library will be:

If the matter remains unresolved, please contact the Phase Leader (Mrs Harrop, KS1; Miss Beattie, KS2). We would also appreciate it if you would keep us informed if there is an issue that may affect your child eg if something has happened at home/within the family/extended family that may have the potential to unsettle your child emotionally or socially.

Year 4 Trip to Verulamium

Year 4 had a great day yesterday visiting the Verulamium Museum in St Albans. We began the day with a lesson looking at artefacts from the Roman era. We investigated what they were used for and what items we use today that were actually invented by the Romans. I was very proud of how much the class were able to remember from our History lessons over the past few weeks to share with the museum expert!

After exploring the museum, and enjoying a well earned lunch, we walked over the to the Roman theatre to get an idea of the scale of their buildings before walking over to see the magnificent hypocaust and its mosaic where many of the children gained inspiration for their own mosaics that we are currently working on in our art lessons.
