

Below are some reading activities which can be done with your child at home. These are only suggestions and do not need to be completed in the homework book, they are just some ways of exploring the reading books.

<p>Change the ending to your book. What happens now to the good and bad characters?</p>	<p>Act out the story with your family or to your family! Use the 'said' words to help show how you need to behave.</p>	<p>Read the description of a setting in a story, keep it in your head and then try to draw it. If you do this with someone else you can see if their drawing looks the same!</p>
<p>Think about a character from a book you have just read. Have you got anything you would like to say to them? Write them a letter to let them know what you are thinking.</p>	<p>Write a book review about the book you have just read. What happened? Who are the characters? Where is it set? Do you think anyone else would like this story?</p>	<p>After reading a book, research the author. What can you find out about them? Have they got any other books you would like to read?</p>
<p>Whilst reading, race someone else to find as many nouns, verbs or adjectives as you can. The person with the most wins!</p>	<p>After reading a story see if you can write a sequel - what happened next? Or write a prequel - what happened to them before the story?</p>	<p>Can you make a book for a friend? You could write lots of interesting facts or write a story about an adventure of you both.</p>
